### Moe Neighbourhood House Overview

#### **OUR VISION**

Moe Neighbourhood House aims to provide support, respect, and a place of belonging through community participation.

#### **OUR MISSION STATEMENT**

Helping the community to build confidence and extend themselves, bringing people together for mutual benefit through the use of skills building and community support.

#### **OUR HISTORY**

Moe Neighbourhood House (MNH) was established in 1983 and became an incorporated association in January 1986. MNH is managed by a volunteer Committee of Management, comprising volunteers and house participants, who have the best interests of the Neighbourhood House and the local community at heart. MNH was originally located over two locations Kingsford St and Service Rd South in Moe.

In 2006 Department of Families Fairness and Housing purchased two portable buildings from the 2006 Commonwealth Games Athletes Village (used by the athletes from Uganda) in Melbourne and had them transported to vacant land that they own in James Street Moe. The Department purposely built a new home for Moe Neighbourhood House which opened in January 2007. For many years Moe Neighbourhood House ran a childcare service, however due to changing community needs, at the end of August 2021 our childcare service ceased operation.

Moe Neighbourhood House works within a community development framework and within a membership-based governance model. This builds social connections and networks based on trust, respect, and reciprocal interaction - known as social capital.

### Manager's Report 2022 -2023 AGM

Hello everyone,

This has been my first full year at the Moe Neighbourhood House and I would like to thank everyone who has supported me so far on this journey. This year we really focused on building relationships with other stakeholders within the community, this includes community members, community groups, and other organisations, as well as behind the seen updates. We saw this as important as we want to build our presence within the community and increase our community engagement.

This financial year (2021-2022) we have had 5,065 visitors come to the Neighbourhood House - please note that this is a conservative number as people don't always sign in upon entering the house. This was roughly 1,000 more visitors than the previous year. It is great to see an increase in the number of community members accessing the House. As I said last year and will continue to say, we hope to see this number continue to grow!

We had a few large events this year. In October 2022 we held our first Quilt Hanging. This was an incredible day with more than 155 Quilts hung, the House was a beautiful display of colour and patterns. This event was to showcase the incredible talents that our quilting students have and to demonstrate the detail and effort that goes into patchwork. At the start of December, we had a community open day for International Day of People with a Disability (IDPwD). This open day acknowledged the contributions and achievements of people with a disability and celebrated our community's inclusiveness. It was a fantastic day with lots of yummy food, fun games and Santa even made an appearance. We had over 70 people attended. In May 2023, we ran another great Market Day for Mother's Day. On the day, it turned out to be terrible weather, however we still had a great number of stalls and community members come through. Even with the bad weather we still managed to raise around \$1,000 which is fantastic! Thank you to everyone who helped with all these fantastic events and made them a success.

This year we have built up our Community Lunch program, averaging 25 people per week. My most enjoyable day for the lunches was our Christmas in July lunch which had 60 people attend. Thanks to Wendy for always making the house look incredible with her decorating. We have had guest speakers attend the lunches and a significant update for our lunch's this year was partnering with Yooralla Drouin Community Hub to volunteer in our kitchen each week! Thank you to everyone who puts in and helps run this program!

We had a few new things at MNH this year which have been very successful:

- Established a new Gippsland Adult Autism Group which has really taken off. On average we have 10 people attend fortnightly.
- Since August 2022 Tabitha's closet has been coming to MNH once a month to help people in our community to access good quality second hand and new clothing for all age groups and genders.



- Launched our new website which looks a lot fresher and modern. We have seen higher amounts of referrals from people who have found out about us from here. As well as receiving expressions of interest directly from our website.
- Knit & Sew 2 Give group started in Term 1 2023 and has been a fantastic venture. It has raised an incredible amount for the house. Knit & Sew 2 Give is a group of people that enjoy getting together to sew, knit or make other craft items for the purpose of fundraising for MNH and donating items to other not for profit organisations.
- All Star Group started in 2023 which is participants from Daily Living Disability Services coming in for fun activities on Mondays.

We have seen an extremely high increase in the demand for food relief support over the past 12 months. Just within the first 6 months of 2023 we saw a 25% increase in people accessing our food hampers compared to 2022. This number sadly continues to grow and MNH will continue to increase how we are supporting those who need it. This includes our involvement in Food For All Latrobe Valley. Food For All Latrobe Valley aims to increase awareness and participation in a range of local food related activities and improve food access and availability for those living in Latrobe Valley.

This financial year we had a real focus on improving and managing our budget and adjusting where necessary to ensure the sustainability of MNH. Receiving our financial report for this year was a positive experience because all our hard work had paid off. Another achievement for this year was upgrading our computer room with all new computers and new software.

I don't think I will ever get used to how diverse and immense the responsibility is of being the Manager of a Neighbourhood House. All I know is that I could not do it without the incredible team of people surrounding me. So, thank you to each and every one of you, Staff, Volunteers, Committee and Community Members, who make MNH the welcoming, enriching and supportive place it is.
